Schools for Africa became Delta Kappa Gamma's first official international project in 2010. Schools for Africa is a partnership with UNICEF, the Hamburg Society and the Nelson Mandela Foundation, helping millions of children access a quality education.

In Africa, nearly one third of the children are still out of school because of inadequate school facilities and poor teacher training. Other factors include the trafficking of adolescents, early marriage, sexual violence and the lack of separate bathrooms in schools causing adolescent girls to stay home.

Schools for Africa currently serves thirteen of the neediest African countries. The program is making a difference with the support of Delta Kappa Gamma by helping to provide a better future for Africa's children. February 24 – Regular Meeting
Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by President DiAnn Richardson with a total of 7 members present.

Not only was she interested in our perceptions of where we belonged, but what we felt we could offer Delta Kappa Gamma in a leadership role using those traits. It was so very interesting and each of the members benefited from the information she and other members shared during the program.

Diane Moose called attention to several items in the minutes from the January 27 meeting as well as other new business.

- Members were asked if any were planning on attending the state DKG Star ³ in Galveston on March 28. No member indicated they planned to attend.
- Members were asked if any had attended the Theta Sigma meeting on Feb. 11 to help raise funds for their scholarship fund. No member had attended.

- Area 3 Workshop, - No specific date was given. The workshop will be the responsibility of the area coordinator and the Beta Omicron chapter in Houston.
- 2020 State Convention – June 17 – 19, will be held in McAllen Texas. Discussion followed on the training for incoming chapter presidents. It was decided that since Anna Gonzales would not be able to attend, Diane Moose might be able to pick up the President's training manual for Anna. It was also made known that the host hotel in McAllen was filling up fast and members wishing to attend the convention should make their reservations as soon as possible.
- Chapter Dues – Members will be asked, starting in March to pay their chapter dues for the 2020- 2021 year. Dues are \$82 plus what members might wish to donate for the chapter Grant In Aid program. Diane Moose recommended that an additional \$20 per member would keep the Grant in Aid program solvent for the coming year.
